


# Welcome to BYO Containers

## What about the regulations?

There is no provision under the Victorian Food Act 1984, the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code or the Primesafe, Dairy-safe or other Regulations which prohibit stores from accepting customers containers. The onus is rightly on customers to provide clean, sanitised and non-porous re-useable containers, and businesses have the right to refuse any containers they feel are unsuitable.

## What can you do?

1. Update your food safety program and risk assessments to provide for BYOC and inform your regulator if required. (Required for Primesafe regulated businesses).
2. Take our free pledge to be listed in our online map and prominently display our poster.
3. Train your staff how to use your scales tare function and safely accept BYO Containers in accordance with your businesses food safety program.
